



## DRYLAND SOMALIA

### DRYLAND AGRICULTURE PROJECT

**Objective:** to support local communities' resilience towards drought and to mitigate the negative impact of Climate Change by improving the agricultural and livelihood sectors

**Results:** 100 shallow wells and 3 deep wells were built in various areas of Puntland (see Map) and irrigation pumps have been distributed, with an increased production of food goods. Moreover, training courses in agricultural technology were delivered to over 180 families as well as seeds for the cultivation, so that the "farm management" of the local rural population was improved. Also the nomads income in the referenced areas results increased.

**Beneficiaries:** Nearly 3 000 families (about 18 000 people) benefit from the construction of the wells, among which are included about 1500 families of IDPs, who settled near the deeper wells, and over 1 000 nomad shepherds who use them for their families and for their livestock, in particular near the Galkayo area.

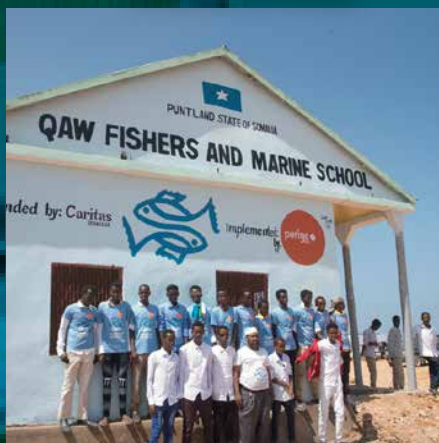


### FISHING AND MARINE SCHOOL PROJECT – PHASE 1

**Objective:** to ensure greater food security for the community and to increase livelihood and employment for young fishermen by providing better-quality education on fishing techniques

**Results:** the first step of the project focussed on the achievement of following results: A 3 years training course based on the principle of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) in fishing and marine subjects has been realised; the construction of the building of the Fishing and Marine School (where the training courses will take place) in the chosen area (see map) has been completed.

**Beneficiaries:** Direct: the project direct beneficiaries are the 25 students per year involved in the Fishing and Marine School training course and their families. Indirect: training professional fishermen who will work in the sector, indirectly benefits the whole fishermen community of the area and, as a consequence, by increasing the availability of fish in local markets, the entire population of the area.



### PHARMA ACTION

**Objective:** to contribute supporting the health sector in Somalia by donating medicines, hospital supplies and equipment and to support response in case of emergency.

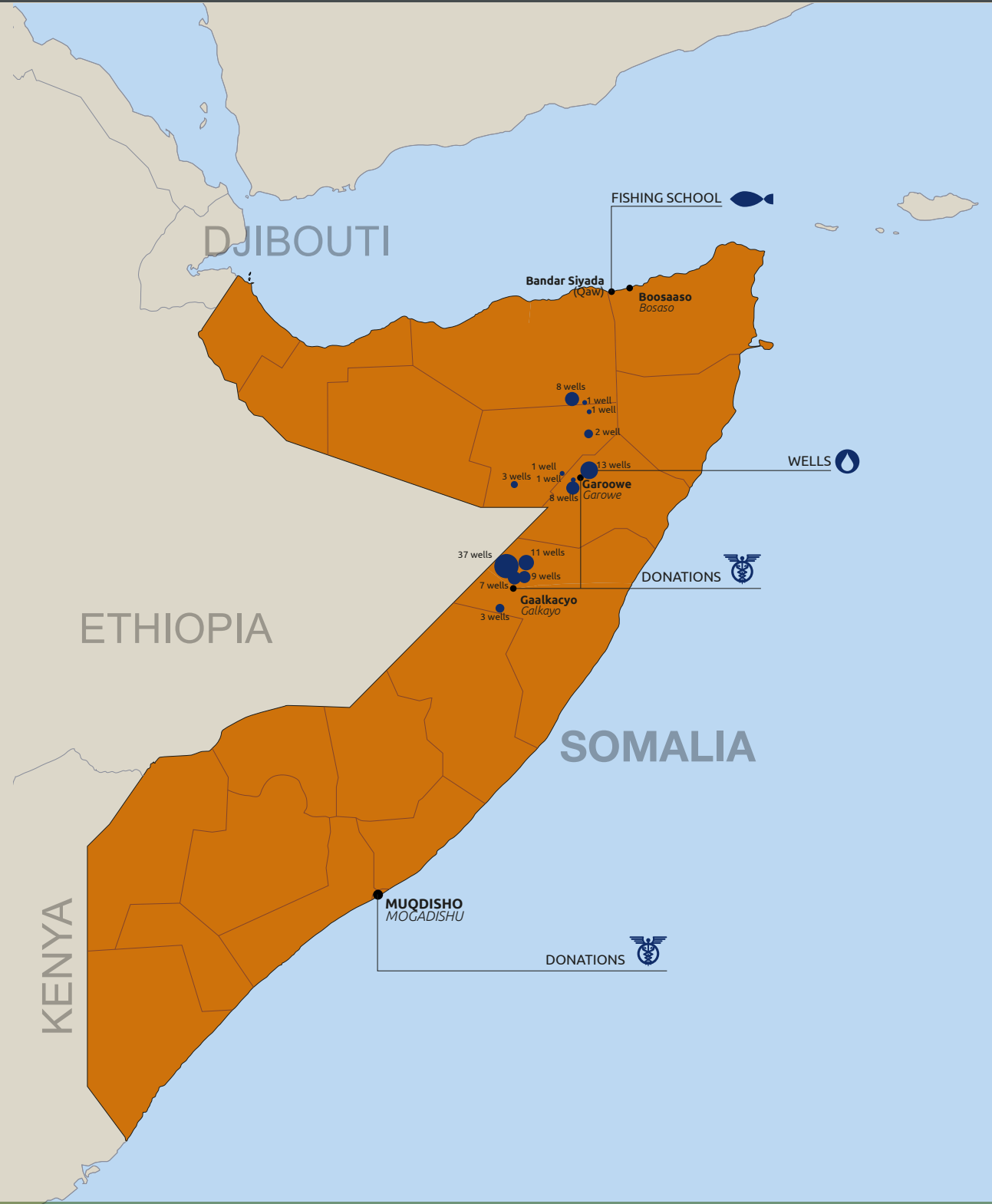
**Results:** Perigo sent the first two containers of medicines, hospital supplies and equipment in 2011 after the huge drought and famine which affected Somalia that year. Since then, Perigo carried on more than 16 donations (as full containers or groupages) of medicines, hospital supplies and equipment till the last donation sent after the terrible attack of the 14th October to support the community efforts' in facing the emergency. The total value of the donations is more than 11 million euros.

**Beneficiaries:** the donations have been distributed to the Hospitals and Health center of the Puntland State of Somalia and to the hospitals and health centers of Mogadishu

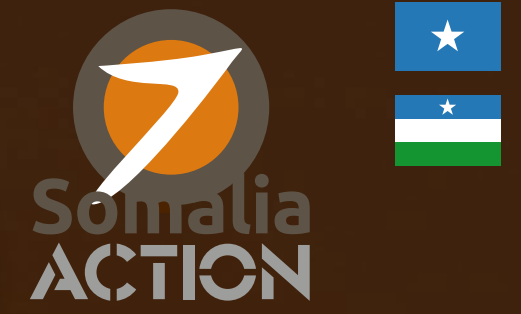




OPERATIVE AREAS OF THE NGO PERIGEO IN SOMALIA
